Vadim Gluzman Born in the former Soviet Union, Gluzman began violin studies at age 7. Moving to Israel in 1990, where he became a student of Yair Kless. In the United States, he studied at the Juilliard School with Dorothy DeLay and Masao Kawasaki. Universally recognized among today's top performing artists, Gluzman's performances are heard around the world through live broadcasts and a striking catalogue of award-winning recordings exclusively for the BIS label. Mr. Gluzman teaches at the Keshet Eilon International Music Center in Israel. He performs on the legendary 1690 'ex-Leopold Auer' Stradivari on extended loan to him through the generosity of the Stradivari Society of Chicago.



Clemens Leske One of Australia's most distinguished pianists, Clemens Leske has been concerto soloist with all of Australia's symphony orchestras (Sydney, Melbourne, Adelaide, Tasmanian, West Australian and Queensland). Leske won numerous prizes and awards, including the ABC Young Performer of the Year, the David Paul Landa Memorial Scholarship (Australia), and the Hattori Award (London). Leske has released three discs of solo piano and chamber music and has recorded extensively for Australian radio stations ABC-FM, 2MBS and 5UV. He is currently Lecturer in Keyboard at the Sydney Conservatorium of Music.



Amelia Gledhill Since receiving her doctorate in English from the University of Sydney, Gledhill has spent the past decade working in the arts and educational sectors. Currently the Manger of the Music & Opera Singers Trust (MOST), Gledhill has overseen large productions such as the ABC Young Performers Awards, the IFAC Handa Australian Singing Competition, the Opera Awards, and Musica Lirica.



Jack Ritch Ritch retired after a long career in property and investment management. Ritch was Chairman and CEO of AMP Capital, Chairman of Melbourne Airport, a major Aged Care group and Galileo Japan Trust. He was National President of the Property Council of Australia.

Ritch led the development of the City Recital Hall in Sydney and is a co-founder of the Australian Friends of Keshet Eilon

Keshet Eilon Music Center and its String Masterclasses were founded in 1990 on Kibbutz Eilon in Western Galilee. The Center's activities are centred upon the belief that music is a profound and natural form of human expression that can build bridges between individuals, cultures, countries and peoples and serve as an international language. This is the origin of the name Keshet, which, in Hebrew, apart from meaning "bow" in the musical sense, can also mean "spectrum" or "rainbow." Keshet Eilon's principal objectives are to foster the talents of young string musicians from Israel and abroad and help them to achieve musical excellence, while at the same time contributing to the development of Israel's Western Galilee region.
